# Sir John Betjeman

Last year, the Museum was given a prestigious file of letters and postcards written by John Betjeman to 'Darling Margie'. These letters chronicle a secret love affair which took place in the early 1970's although they had known each other 40 years earlier. This file of correspondence has been donated to the Museum because although Margie never made the affair public in her lifetime she 'thought it would be helpful for some future student writing about John Betjeman for his or her thesis'. Margie had written accounts of the love affair and of her life and these were included in the gift to the Museum.

Because of their great value, both in monetary and academic terms, we have decided to store the original letters at the Oxfordshire History Centre for safekeeping but digital copies will be available at the Museum.

You can see from the sample reprinted here how difficult his writing is on this postcard from the Isle of Man on 22nd September 1970 and there is still one word I can't decipher.

He writes:

That was a DELICIOUS and wonderful evening last week. Since it I have been exploring every glen and bay and lane of this wonderful island – but the weather has made filming impossible and I return to-morrow. My love is......for you. John B
