
### Museum Launch and WWI Exhibition

It has been a hectic few weeks since the Museum Launch in April. It was lovely to see so many of you at the Launch when the Exhibition, 'Remembering 1914', was officially opened by Councillor Yvonne Constance. Emma Banks, who pointed us in the direction of a Micro Consultancy grant for our new technology, and our Museum Mentor, Carol Anderson, also came to see our new presentations in operation. They were both impressed with what we had



achieved. If you have not visited the museum recently, we hope you will be pleasantly surprised by the changes.

Do look out for the new computer presentation which links a map of the village in 1914 with the 1911 census. Poppies represent the homes of our WWI servicemen. By touching the poppies our new computer provides information on the men who went to war and a picture of their house at the time.



### BBC visit Uffington for Betjeman programme



A.N. Wilson and a BBC 4 film crew came to Uffington to film a programme about Sir John Betjeman. As well as the museum they visited Garrards Farm and St. Mary's Church.

The famous writer and newspaper columnist, known for his critical biographies, and the BBC producer were both very complimentary about the museum. A.N. Wilson wrote in our visitors' book – 'the best <u>local</u> museum in England'!

Andrew Wilson was also very interested in Thomas Hughes and we were trying to persuade the producer to make a programme about his life and works too! The programme about Betjeman is due to go out in July on BBC4.
