



### Christmas Event - Sunday 16th December

## Exhibition - There but Not There

Feedback on this year's exhibition commemorating the end of the First World War has been very positive. Over one hundred and sixty local men served in the Great War from the Uffington area, sadly thirty did not return. Biographies told the story of some of those men and explained the affect the war had on village life. The Beavers produced a wonderful collage that was displayed in the museum alongside the exhibition.



The Brownies used some of the information from the exhibition to create a display in the church on Remembrance Sunday. The museum opened for an hour after the Service and over forty people visited to see the exhibition for the final time.

## Update on the Old Schoolroom repairs

For those that live locally you will see that the long awaited repairs to the Old Schoolroom have been completed by the stonemason. Jan Kerr and his team have done a fantastic job of repairing the walls, reducing the height of the chimney, adding metal guttering to both sides of the building and landscaping outside the building. Fernham Road adjacent to the museum has been made wider with the surprise discovery of a sarsen wall holding up the museum bank. Following a donation of 2,000 bulbs from the Faringdon Rotary Club, we are looking forward to a carpet of crocuses in the spring. The Parish Council held a 'thank you' event at the end of October to formally acknowledge everyone who had contributed to the fund raising. Funds have also been set aside to enable repairs and cleaning for the windows in the spring.
